## Letter from the Chair

### **Welcome, and thank you for attending the 2026 NCSF Annual Meeting.**

Our 2024 Annual Meeting Survey asked our Coalition Partners about how they wanted to spend their time in our meeting. Based on the feedback received, we've implemented significant changes to our Annual Meeting, aiming to enhance your experience. In 2025, you provided even more information to help us refine, and you will see those changes reflected today. We hope this new format resonates more with you. Our commitment to improvement will continue. Please help us continue to serve your needs by completing the [2026 Annual Meeting Survey](#).

### **Notable changes include:**

- All program and project reports will be informative and distributed several weeks before the meeting for your convenience to read and formulate questions.
- While we will fulfill regulatory requirements by reviewing our finances and budget, we intend to limit the time spent on details. Financial reports will be available for you both before and after the meeting.
- We will continue educating our Coalition Partners as we have in the past, but we're working hard to make this content more relevant to you moving forward in the current political landscape.
- In direct response to your feedback, we have prepared a presentation that offers more detail about our work, dedicating a significant portion of our time to it.

NCSF is frequently amazed at how much we achieve each year with minimal funding and an all-volunteer staff, and this year is no different.

### **Some of our achievements include:**

- Created the Freedom & Privacy Project and assisted 6 private membership clubs dealing with "Sexually Oriented Business" regulations designed to shut them down. An additional 7 groups/clubs required media assistance, and 2 events received Raid Guide training.
- Tabling Training was created for Consent Counts so volunteers can exhibit at local/regional events in a cost-effective way.
- Conducted a Choking Survey and our 4<sup>th</sup> Consent Survey in 2025, along with assisting The Science of BDSM Team in creating the Post-scene Negotiation Study.
- Did a Constituency Survey to identify needs and resources NCSF may provide.
- Published 2 papers in peer-reviewed journals and participated in the creation of a Call-to-Action paper on choking.
- NCSF participated in the development of new Kink Clinical Guidelines along with TASHRA, DSREI, and the Center for Positive Sexuality.

Thank you again to all our donors: Coalition Partner Fundraisers, Event Fundraisers, Generous Donors, and Members who created fundraisers. Thank you to everyone who donated, shared, and spread the message!

To our members, volunteers, staff, and board, who work tirelessly to fight for the rights of our communities: **Thank you for believing in the mission and fighting for the sexual freedom of our communities.** Much of this work is thankless and is rarely acknowledged. So please know that the NCSF's accomplishments and goal achievements are credited to everyone's participation and support as we progress.

## NCSF Data and Information

We are often asked how NCSF knows what we know and how we decide what to work on. We thought it would be a good opportunity to explain that.

NCSF's Incident Reporting & Response (IRR) program is a resource for members of the kink, polyamory, and Lifestyle communities and for people seeking information about them. IRR provides educational information and referrals to services for individuals, groups, clubs, events, and professionals.

We help hundreds of people each year, which is where NCSF gets data and statistics to help us develop resources.

Things we can help you with:

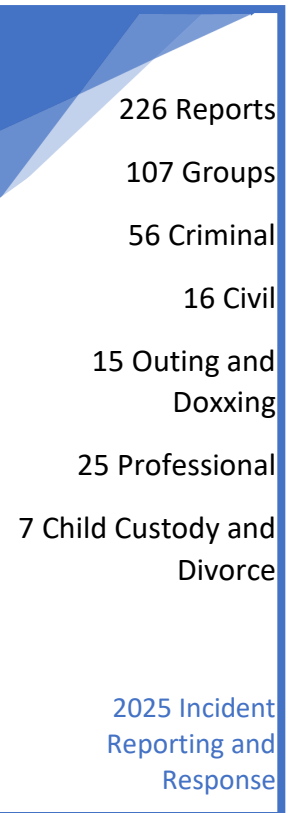
- Legal issues
- Discrimination issues (including the government)
- Consent issues
- Policy and Procedure
- Legal Liability

**IRR Stats:** The IRR Team assisted with 226 reports received by NCSF's Incident Reporting & Response program in 2025.

As patterns develop or discover a need, we research, create resources and launch projects.

**Why don't you know about these things we will discuss?** Often, you do, but you may only know one (1) person, which may seem like an anomaly in your community.

Because many of the issues NCSF deals with never appear in the media, or they hit the media and are gone quickly, we rely on our more expansive IRR data to show patterns and larger areas for concern. NCSF has been taking reports from groups for 28 years, and we have amassed a database of issues and are able to see the trends in what is happening in our communities on a broader scale.



## Donation Report

## Incident Reporting and Response

Susan Wright, Executive Director

### Introduction

- The NCSF Incident Reporting & Response (IRR) program provides assistance to individuals, groups, and businesses who are involved in the kink, polyamory, and Lifestyle communities and for people seeking information about them.
- NCSF maintains the confidentiality of those who come to us for help. However, we balance that need with the need to report on the services we are providing and to provide the community with a record of where the need is the greatest.

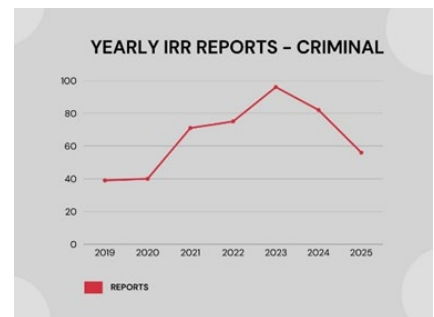
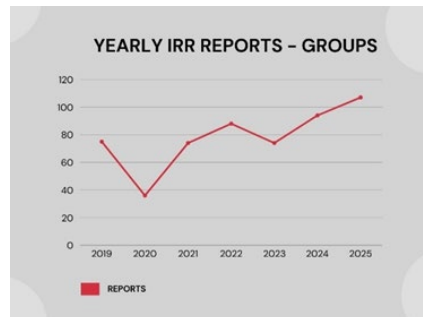
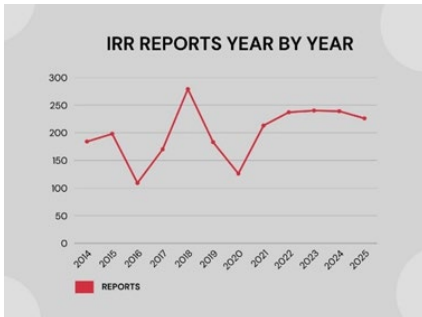
### Executive Summary

#### 2025 Trends

- **Attacks on private membership clubs:** 6 private membership clubs needed assistance dealing with local authorities trying to apply or create “Sexually Oriented Business” regulations to shut them down. An additional 7 groups needed assistance with media reports about the legality of their existence. Another 2 groups needed Raid Guide training.
- **Decline in reports in the second half of 2025:** There was a marked difference between the first half of 2025, with 148 reports in January-June, compared to 83 in July-December. This is true across all categories, with reports nearly halved (44% drop) in the latter half of 2025.
- **Reports about Kink/CNM community organizers:** 11% of those accused of a consent violation were community organizers compared to 20% in the previous few years. However, 9 of the 15 outing reports (60%) stated that a community organizer outed them.
- **Defamation:** Reports dropped by 33% from 15 reports to 10 reports.
- **Choking:** We received 5 reports of nonconsensual erotic choking (also 5 reports in 2024).

Looking Ahead

Group reports are trending upward, while Criminal reports are trending downward. We will likely continue to see an increase in reports about interpersonal disputes, necessitating referrals to KAP professionals such as mediators and mental health professionals. 9% of Criminal reports involved choking, which means additional community education about the liability risks of practice is needed.

## PR Committee

**Susan Wright, Spokesperson**

### Introduction

- The PR Committee manages NCSF’s social media by building awareness about NCSF and providing education about our projects and consent to enhance our presence and be more effective at broadcasting our information. The PR Committee falls under the [Media Outreach Program](#) which does media advocacy for kink and non-monogamy groups, events and individuals on request. Here is our social media [Policy & Procedures](#).
- The PR Committee meet once a quarter (January, April, July & October) on the 3rd Monday of the Month at 8:30 Eastern. Currently, of 14 members, 7 members attend meetings.

### Executive Summary

- Shadow-banning continues to seriously impact NCSF’s social media outreach, however our reach has increased somewhat in 2025 due to abandoning hashtags.
- Markedly fewer articles are being published that fit our Media Update criteria due to the banning of these words. This is the 4<sup>th</sup> year of a steady decline in MUs and Interviews we’ve given (see Media Update graph below). In our mainstream PR, we may need to stop using shadow-banned words such as “kink” “BDSM” and “swinging” or shadow banning will stifle media coverage of Explicit Prior Permission.
- There has been an increase in negative media about kink and nonmonogamy. For example, in October these negative articles were published:

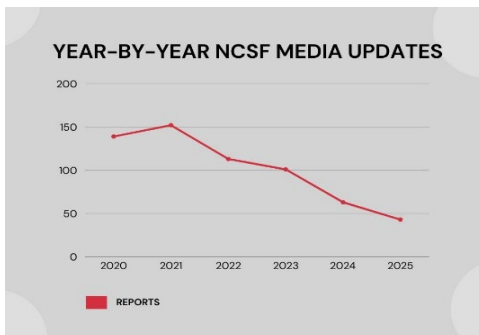

Kink & Polyamory Aware Professionals (KAP) is a service dedicated to providing the community with referrals to mental health, medical, legal, and other professionals who are knowledgeable about, and sensitive to, diverse expressions of sexuality.

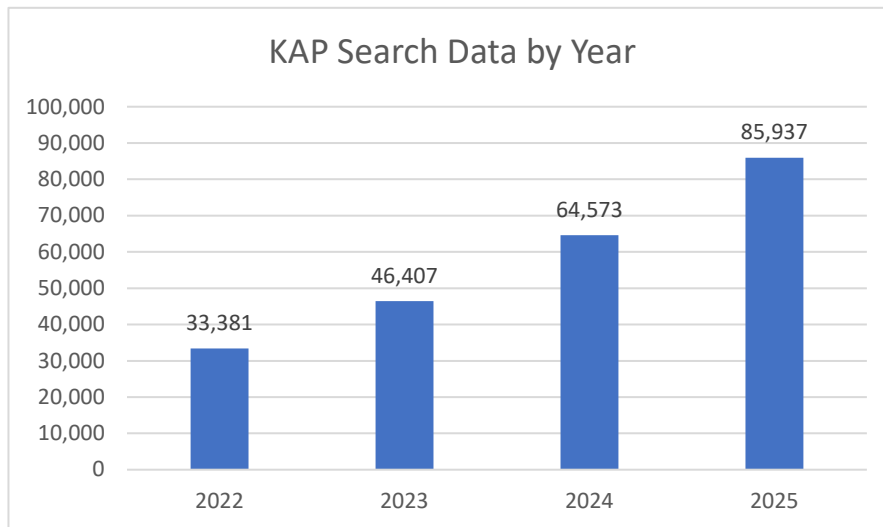
Every professional on the KAP referral list must believe that any form of consensual sexuality between adults can be considered healthy if practiced in a safe and responsible manner. Some of the forms of sexuality we refer to include BDSM, swinging, polyamory, consensual non-monogamy, crossdressing, leather, and fetishes.

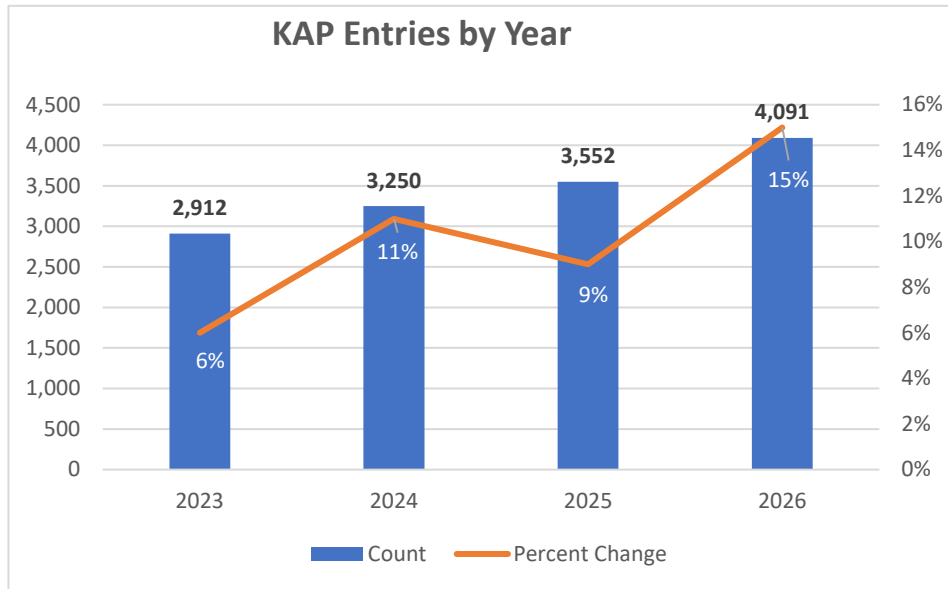

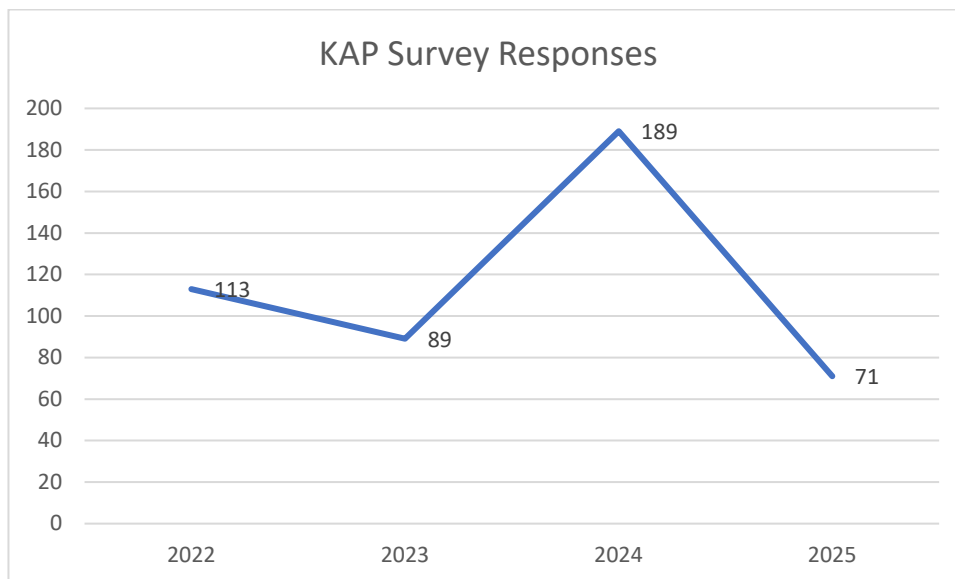

### Introduction

- Our objective is to decriminalize sexual conduct between consenting adults. As part of this we spread understanding of the need for, and nature of, consent. Our Consent Counts program assists our communities in promoting a culture of consent through education and providing resources on how to deal with nonconsensual incidents. A chief goal is to decriminalize consensual BDSM that does not result in serious physical injury, by ensuring that consent will be recognized as a valid defense to criminal charges brought under assault laws and other statutes.
- The Consent Counts Committee meets every month on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday at 5:30 PM Eastern. There are 71 active members with 26 joining in 2025, including attorneys, victim advocates, researchers and community members.

### Executive Summary

- The Model Penal Code on Sexual Assault was not published in November 2025, therefore our State Lobbying Teams are on hold pending publication. The ALI's website [states](#): "Drafting of this project is completed; preparation of the official text is in progress." - Our 2025 goal to accelerate our professional education and outreach was successful. - It was not possible to do any education for college campuses in 2025. There was a resurgence in negative media about campus sex weeks and kink groups (See PR report).

- We will continue with anti-sexual assault messaging and our anti-choking campaign, which are well-supported by harm reduction agencies and public defenders/prosecutors.

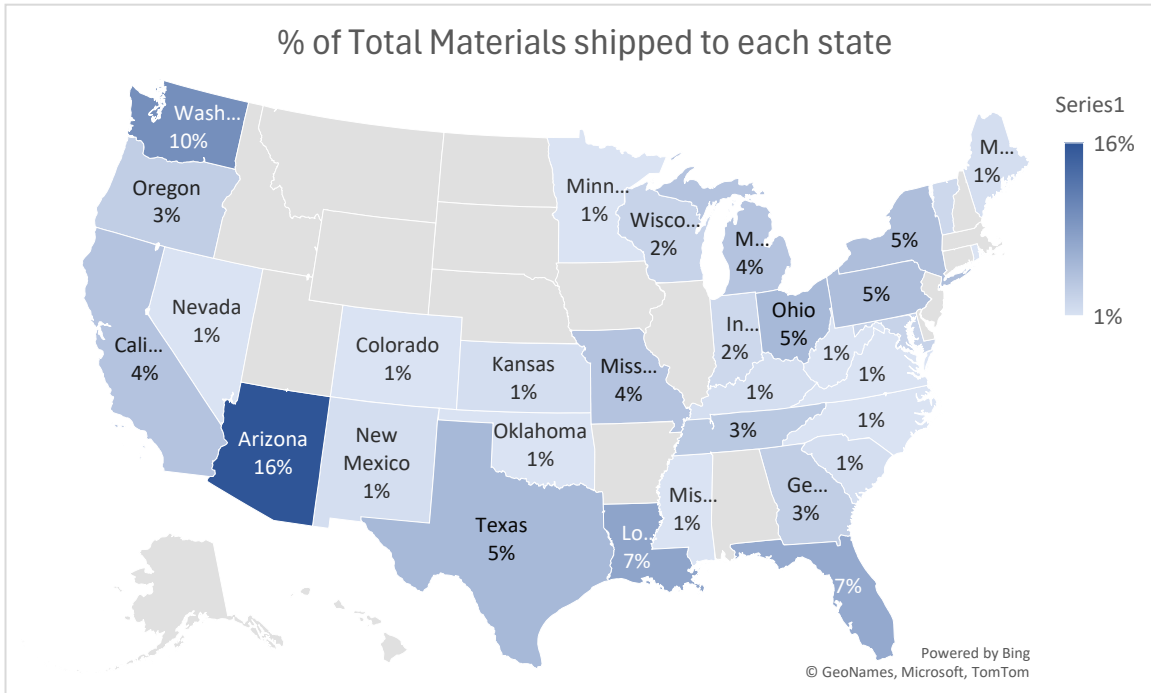

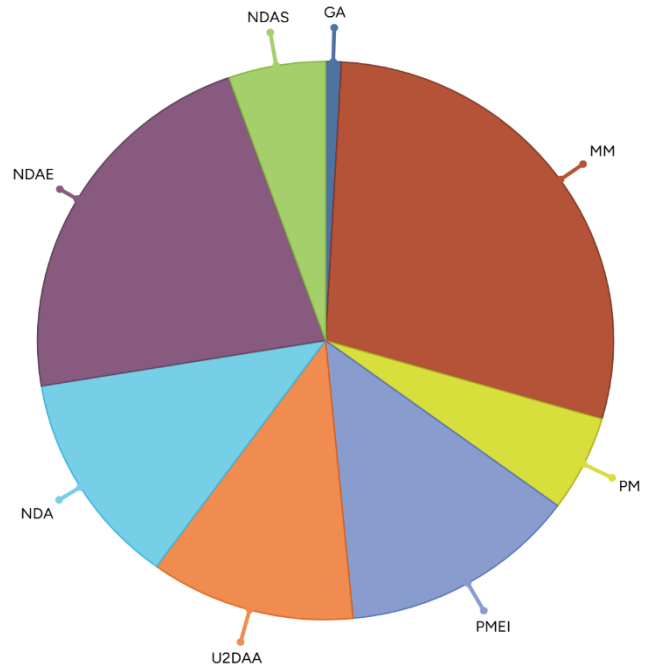

### Introduction

NCSF engages in outreach to professional organizations in order to fulfill our mission of creating a political, legal, and social environment in the US that advances equal rights for consenting adults who engage in alternative sexual and relationship expressions.

### Executive Summary

NCSF participated in 11 professional conferences and workshops in 2025. There were three standout events:



### American Psychological Association Conference

- NCSF exhibited at APA Conference in Denver, CO in August 2025. It was an inspiring 3 days with more than 10,000 psychologists, academicians, practitioners, researchers, students, and others in attendance.

#### Looking Ahead

The Research Committee will complete current projects, and will create Commons slides based on our recent choking and consent research for educators to use. The data from our Constituent Survey will assist in creating new NCSF resources.

The Research Committee will continue to track research that impacts our communities. For example, since 2020, research shows a rise in anti-LGBT sentiment in America. [One analysis](#) of 2.5 million responses from Americans collected from the beginning of 2021 through 2024 revealed that progress has reversed: “The largest increases in bias emerged for sexuality, transgender, race and skin-tone bias; 10-108% increases on explicit and 6-13% increases on implicit measures.” The research found these trends were distinctly present among the youngest American adults, with those under 25 increasing their animus against marginalized groups in general, and gay people in particular, at a faster rate than older Americans. And while anti-gay bias has risen faster among conservatives, it has also risen among liberals.

## Coalition Partner Liaison Report

**Tess Zachary, Chairperson**

### Introduction

The Coalition Partner Liaison was created to embody the work that Jackie Harris was already doing on our Board of Directors. Engaging our Coalition Partners is essential for fostering community, promoting advocacy, and achieving the NCSF's goals. With the loss of our friend and irreplaceable advocacy partner, Jackie "Bebe" Harris, in 2023, NCSF took a little time getting our feet underneath us, reaching out to Coalition Partners, and keeping them engaged.

Some of the things we've always done were Coalition Partner Town Halls, Newsletters, and Media Updates.

- Coalition Town Halls gained popularity during the pandemic shutdowns. Still, they dramatically dropped off when the world opened again, so we had to reimagine how to connect.
- We tried to do a private Coalition Partner forum, but a lack of engagement did not balance the effort to maintain it.

### 2025 Summary

**Reimagined Town Halls:** Our new Town Hall format calls for fewer meetings but brings substantive education to our Coalition Partners, which can include outside experts. Including our Coalition Partners means we can have a franker conversation on the subject matter, like bringing IRR data and Research to our recent Liability presentation. The most recent Town Hall on liability issues was the most attended since the pandemic so we may have found a winning formula.

**Personalized Welcome Emails:** While, at times, we are a little tardy in sending them, we've begun to send customized emails to new and renewed Coalition Partners, which directs them to resources that apply to them, tools at their disposal, and current issues they should know about. While this takes much more time than a form letter, our engagement with those welcome emails is significantly higher.

**SWAG:** A long-time supporter reminded us that we used to send a package of goodies to new Coalition Partners that included materials and a sticker. They told us that they thought it was neat, and it is a shame we don't do this anymore. So, in 2024 we began to do this again. We ordered some stickers, put together packages of materials along with an NCSF pin, and whatever other small things, and we mail them to Coalition Partners once they confirm an address from their welcome email.

### Looking Ahead

We will continue to go forward with our reimagined Town Halls, Personalized Welcome Emails, and SWAG packages. Still, we are also looking into a format for Action Alerts and other ways for important bite-size pieces of information keeping our Coalition Partners up to date on our work and the issues that affect them.

## Freedom and Privacy Project

**Tess Zachary**

### Introduction

As we continue to fight Sexually Oriented Business Ordinances, and the myth of Adverse Secondary Effects, we came to realize that more education in our community is necessary. So, we have created the Freedom and Privacy Project, dedicated to protecting our groups and clubs from administrative and judicial discrimination.

We are currently working on six (6) different cases under this project, with 12 of them having been brought to us in 2025. We do not publish private information, and we often hold details until things are settled, but if you would like to see some of our press packages/press releases, [visit the Freedom and Privacy Page](#).

### Some things you should know

**What is the Sexually Oriented Business Tax?** This is a fee that must be paid for every customer by businesses that provide live nude entertainment, or live nude performances as defined by the jurisdiction, and authorize on premises consumption of alcoholic beverages regardless of whether the business is required to hold a license or permit under the Alcoholic Beverage Code. A SOB tax can be applied retroactively for every customer who has entered if your club is labeled as an SOB by the authorities.

In United States law, a sexually oriented business (S.O.B.[1]) is a business that is part of the sex industry, such as sites of erotic performance and erotic paraphernalia stores. Often regulations of SOBs enter law as part of zoning regulations by jurisdictions when trying to maintain the character of a particular community and discourage elements of society that may be considered harmful for their connection to the sex industry.[2] Though many regulations of SOBs arguably violate First Amendment rights in the United States, lawmakers will use the secondary effects doctrine—in which restrictions of First Amendment rights are legal if the restrictions can prevent harm to the larger community—to justify regulation of SOBs.

### **What are the Obscenity Laws?**

Obscenity laws prohibiting sexual activity in the view of the public. The municipality will see you as “public” if you don’t have a “barrier to entry”. A barrier to entry must be ‘real’. If someone can pay and walk in, that isn’t a barrier to entry. There is some well-defined case law about this: *Eagle v Chicago*, *Power Exchange v California*. In many jurisdictions, obscenity laws are invoked when someone goes to an authority and says, “I am offended”, and that is enough for probable cause. Then you are on the defense.

### **What are Adverse Secondary Effects?**

These studies are used to justify closing sexually oriented businesses, or when no correlation to crime or lowered property values is shown, to allow clubs to remain open.

In *Los Angeles v. Alameda Books* (2002) the court found that evidence that was shoddy or not derived from a specific area does not justify regulation, and the ruling places the burden of proof on the government for collecting “substantial” data to justify the claims of adverse secondary effects.

#### Looking Ahead

NCSF will help anyone who comes to us for any administrative (Zoning, SOB, etc.) or judicial (Injunctions, etc.), it isn't always possible to successfully defend these clubs. Some of the reasons we are not successful:

1. A club refuses our help. While this sounds unbelievable, some people have concerns of outing and other personal issues. If someone cannot attend public hearings or appear in court, it is difficult to challenge municipalities. Also, sometimes an attorney simply does not want to speak to us, or allow us to assist.
2. Intentional disregard for the laws of the municipality. While discriminatory enforcement is absolutely something NCSF will help with, there is not much that can be done when state license requirements, applications have been falsified, or zoning ordinances were intentionally disregarded.
3. When groups, clubs, or events don't take our advice. If we share with someone what was successful, and they do something else despite NCSF or attorney advice, there is little we can do.

## Fundraising Information

### NCSF's Budget

Remember, no one at NCSF collects a salary. NCSF's administrative expenses are less than 10% of our total budget, so more than 90% goes directly to the work that we do. Our administrative expenses are limited to what we absolutely need, such as insurance, website costs, subscriptions, bank fees, credit card processing, and Zoom.

### Where funds are needed:

- **Explicit Prior Permission:** When Explicit Prior Permission is funded, we need to cover travel/support expenses for lobbying. Building a 'war chest' for lobbying is essential.
- **The Freedom and Privacy Project:** Sexually Oriented Business Taxes/Ordinances are expensive, and we want to address as many of these as we are able. It often involves last-minute travel and legal fees.
- **Education Outreach:** We've mentioned several times today that we need to trade Professional Conferences for constituency conferences. We don't want to have to make that trade-off. They are all important.

### Coalition Partner Fundraising

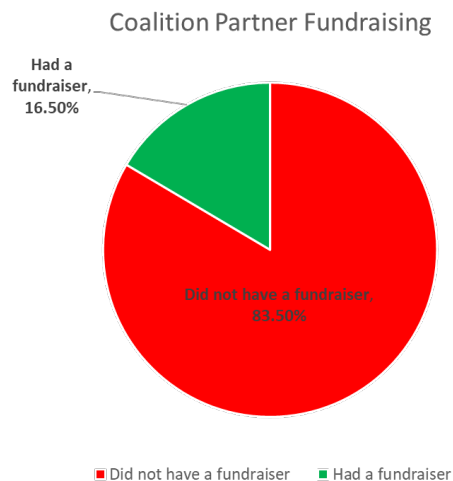
Coalition Partners agree to host a fundraiser for us, but there is no fundraising threshold.

## Membership Report

### Introduction

- The Board has the exclusive authority to review, approve, or disapprove an application for membership, or to remove membership, in its sole discretion, and shall not be required to state its reasons therefore. The Membership Coordinator facilitates the membership and donation processing, and sets up NCSF events payment processing.

### Executive Summary

- We are holding steady at 110 Coalition Partners at the end of 2025 compared to 115 in 2024, 112 in 2023, and 116 in 2022. We list all of our [Coalition Partners](#) on our website.
- Our Supporting Members dropped by 8 members to 64 (9% decline). We have opt-in [Supporting Membership](#) listing on our website.
- Our individual members dropped by 44 members, from 149 to 104 (31% decline). This likely reflects the instability of our communities in 2025. It also is an indication that our various attempts to gain individual members (membership cards, special discounts by groups) has not proven to be enough incentive for individuals to pay the \$25 membership fee.

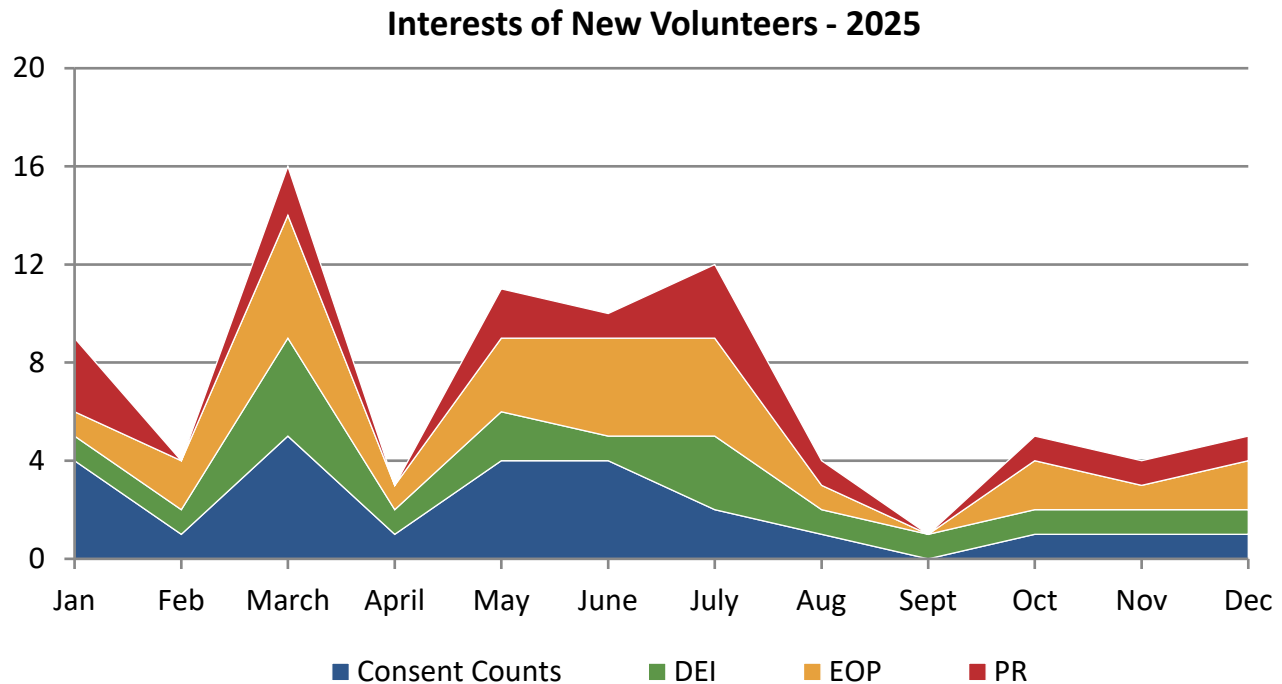
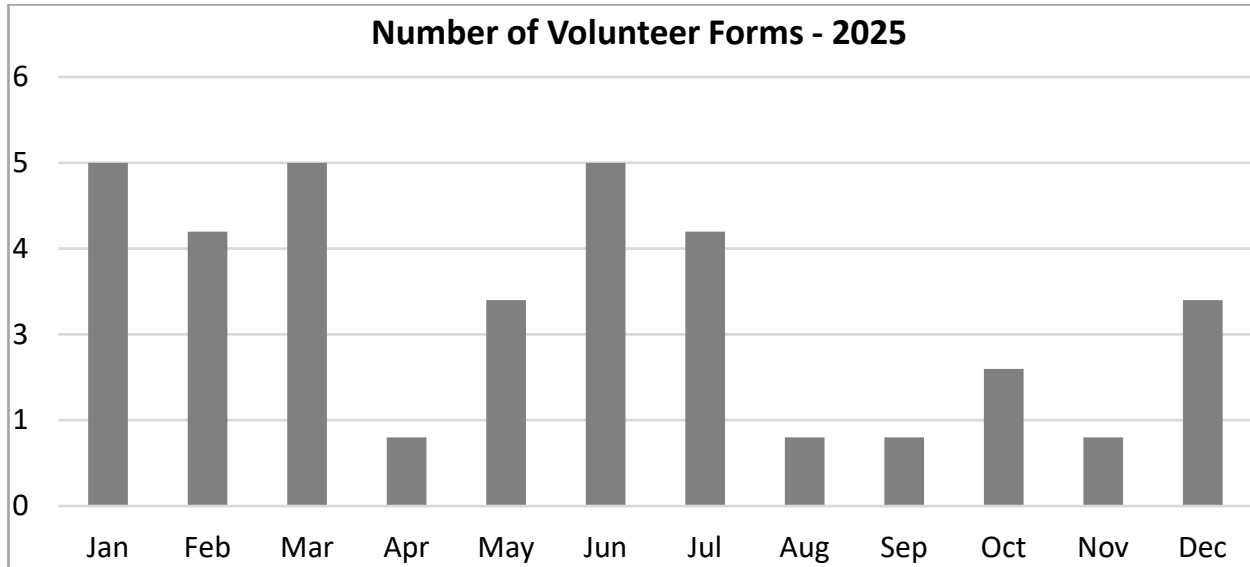
Looking Ahead

NCSF and ITCR are separate entities that operate together to fulfill the overall mission of the NCSF. While funds cannot be comingled or transferred between the two organizations, the following graphs show combined key financial trends for those interested.





## Institute for 21st Century Relationships: The Foundation of the NCSF (ITCR)

### Executive Summary

**The ITCR received a record, one-time donation of \$100,000. Without this gracious and unexpected gift, the continued decline of all other donations would have had a significantly negative consequence on ITCR's 2025 Revenue. This donation came at a critical time for the ITCR and NCSF constituent groups as our New Freedom and Privacy Project continues to grow.**

Excluding the large donation, ITCR's 2025 Revenue **decreased** by 67% to \$11,925 from 2024's Revenue of \$36,306 and is 54% of our COVID low of \$20,675. ITCR's revenue, excluding the year's large donation, was below expectations primarily due to a significant decrease in large, one-time donations. Also, the number of smaller donations, which are critical to ITCR's long-term viability, continues to decline. They are less frequent and in smaller quantities than before the pandemic. Including the donation, ITCR's Revenue increased by 208% to \$111,925.

**ITCR Expenses remained flat despite the preparation of lobbying efforts and the delivery of FPP services.**

Expenses decreased by 4% in 2025 to \$49,801 from \$52,099 in 2024 and less than ITCR's high of \$58,337 in 2019. As expected, the largest expense categories were "Travel & Meeting." This category includes airfare and gas/mileage reimbursement, as applicable, conference entry fees, and related conference expenses for events where ITCR is represented. The remainder of expenses in the "Travel and Meeting" category are for travel that was necessary under our "Freedom and Privacy Project."

**Net Cash increased significantly due to a one-time \$100,000 donation.**

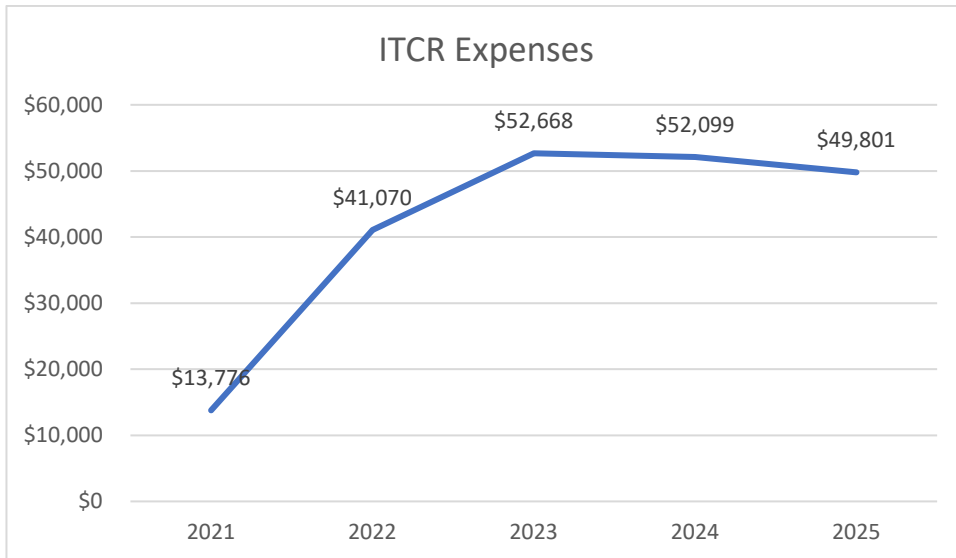
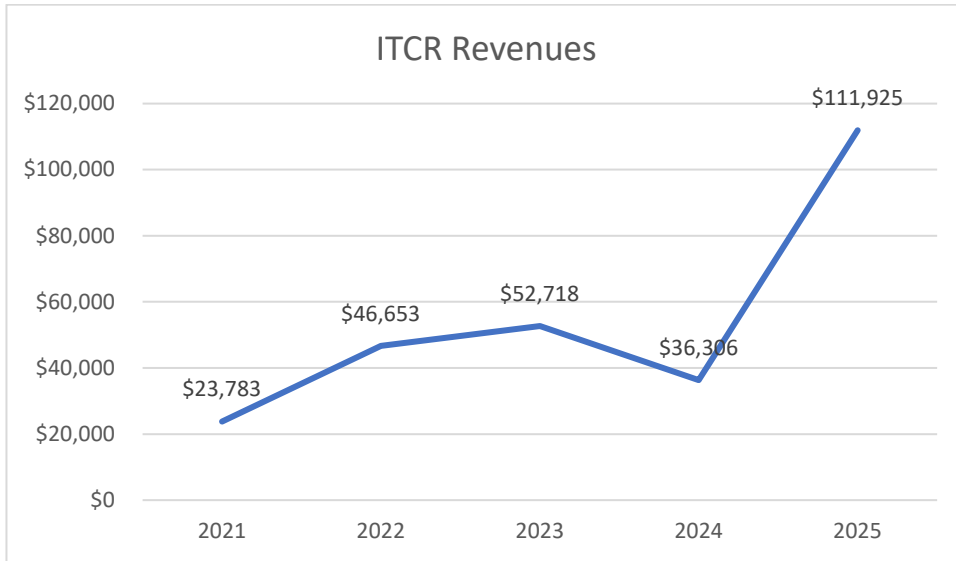
Net Cash (change at the end of the year from the prior year) increased by \$70,366 due to the donation. Cash Reserves remain somewhat high at \$137,779.

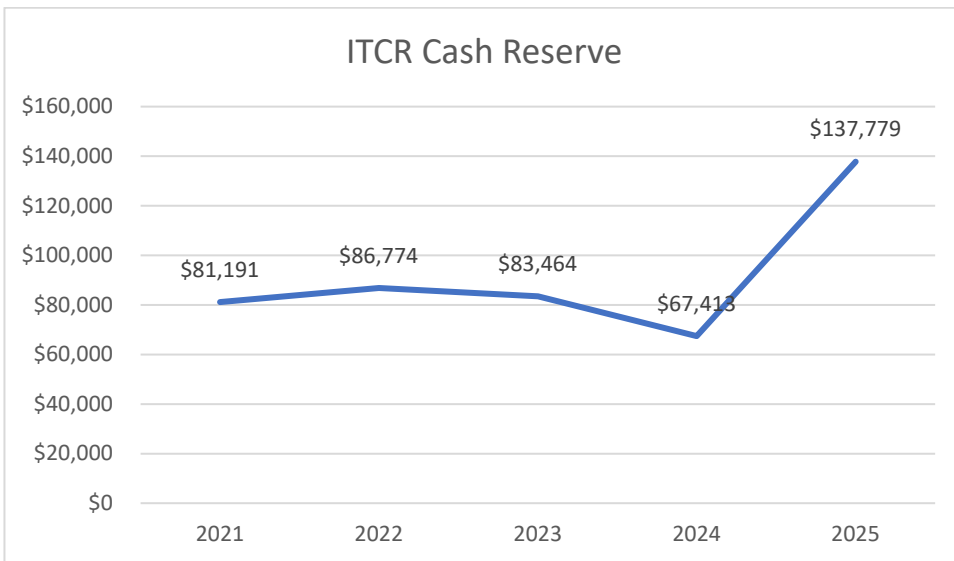
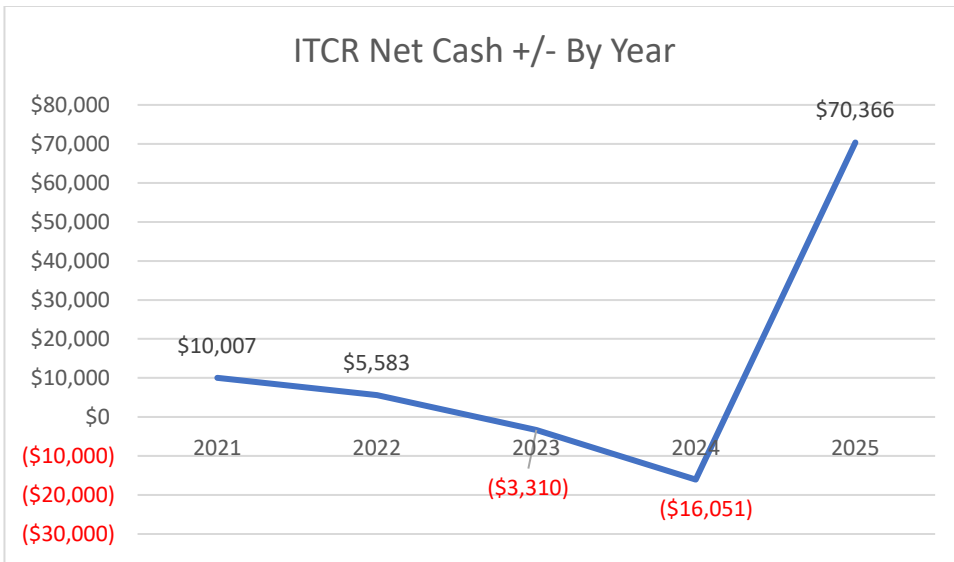
**Note: The ITCR cannot depend on receiving substantial donations in the future. Our primary revenue sources have consistently come from our members' support.**

NOTE: Several journal entries were made to correct the ITCR checking account opening balance in the new Quickbooks account, matching it to bank statements. The original opening balance input into Quickbooks was the ending balance in the old Quickbooks account which included corrupt data. This has the effect of matching QB asset total to bank statement balances by decreasing formerly reported assets in Quickbooks by \$6,452 in 2019. This corrects a data entry error from 2019.

## National Coalition for Sexual Freedom (NCSF)

### Executive Summary

**NCSF Revenue in 2025 decreased by 1% over the prior year. Revenue growth rates continue to decline. The 3 year average growth rate is 6%. Pre-COVID growth rates were more favorable: In the 3 years before the lockdowns, the average annual growth rate was 23%. Annual revenues are still below pre-COVID levels.**

Historically, the majority of NCSF revenue came from the fundraising activities of a large number of Coalition Partners. This changed in 2020. NCSF currently relies upon fewer, larger one-time or occasional donations.

**Expenses increased as NCSF broadens on-site representation and education efforts in its constituent communities.**

Expenses increased by 43% in 2025 over the prior year, to \$47,109 from \$33,022. Expenses in 2025 are approximately the same as pre-COVID (\$44,962 in 2019). Last year's largest expense category was "Travel and Meeting." This includes airfare and gas/mileage reimbursement for NCSF liaisons as applicable, conference entry fees, and related conference expenses for events and conferences where NCSF is represented. **NCSF continues to increase its presence and visibility by increasing the number and breadth of constituent events and professional conferences it attends.** NCSF's cost per constituent event has decreased as we continue to train and deploy quality volunteers regionally.

The remainder of expenses in the "Travel and Meeting" category are for travel that was necessary under our "Freedom and Privacy Project." Learn more about this project, go to <https://ncsfreedom.org/the-freedom-and-privacy-project/>.

**Net Cash decreased for the first time in 4 years, depleting our Cash Reserve slightly.**

NCSF's "Net Cash Increase" was -\$1,342, which decreased our Cash Reserves to \$88,204. The NCSF is a not-for-profit organization and does not have a goal of making money. However, it does need Cash Reserves to continue fulfilling its mission when the NFP environment is generally unfavorable, and especially given the current uncertain political environment.

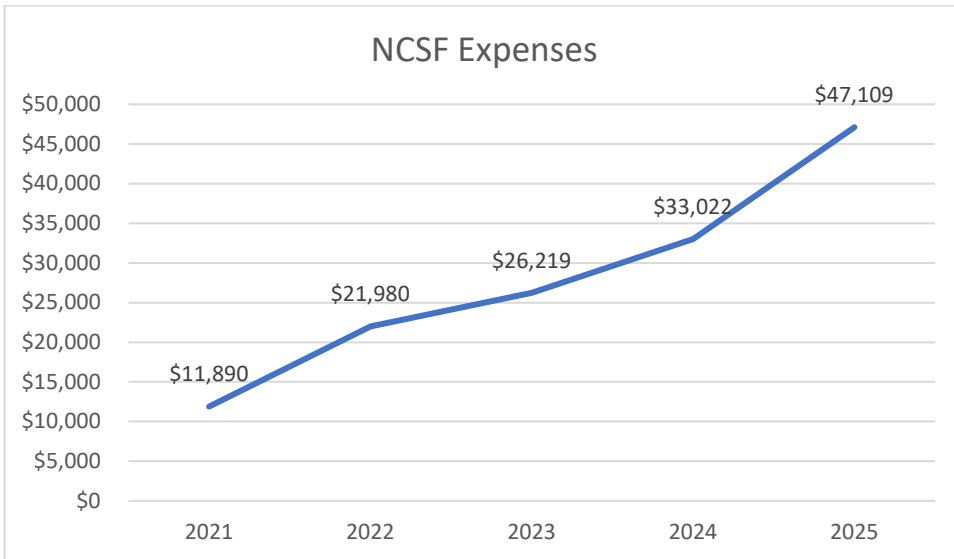
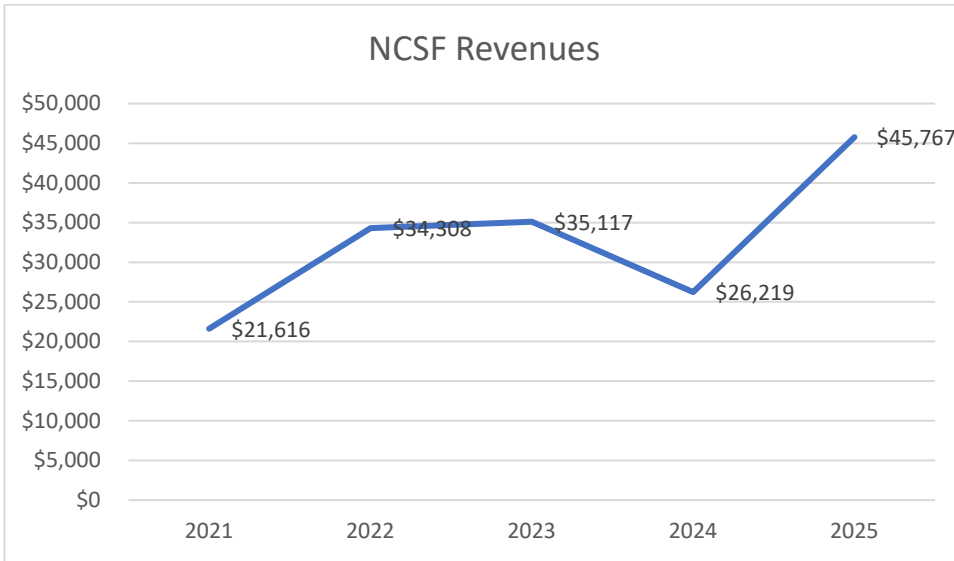
**The NCSF's financial environment continues to be challenging in the Post-COVID world.**

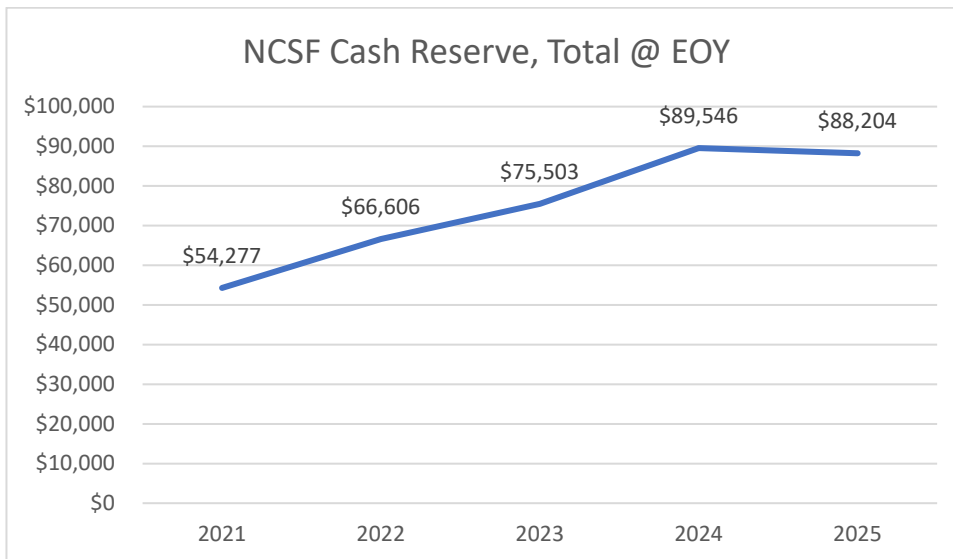
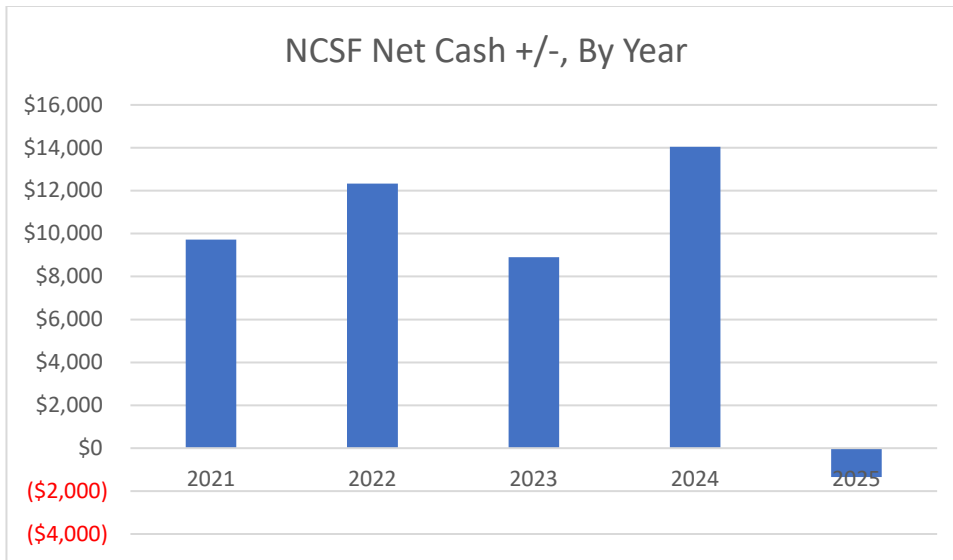
Our pre-pandemic revenue was from a larger number of sources than it is in the post-COVID environment, and a significant amount was from modest but numerous Coalition Partner fundraisers. Post-lockdown revenue can be characterized as coming from fewer sources, but in greater amounts.

This has the effect decreasing formerly reported assets in Quickbooks by \$553, and of matching QB assets to bank statement balances.
